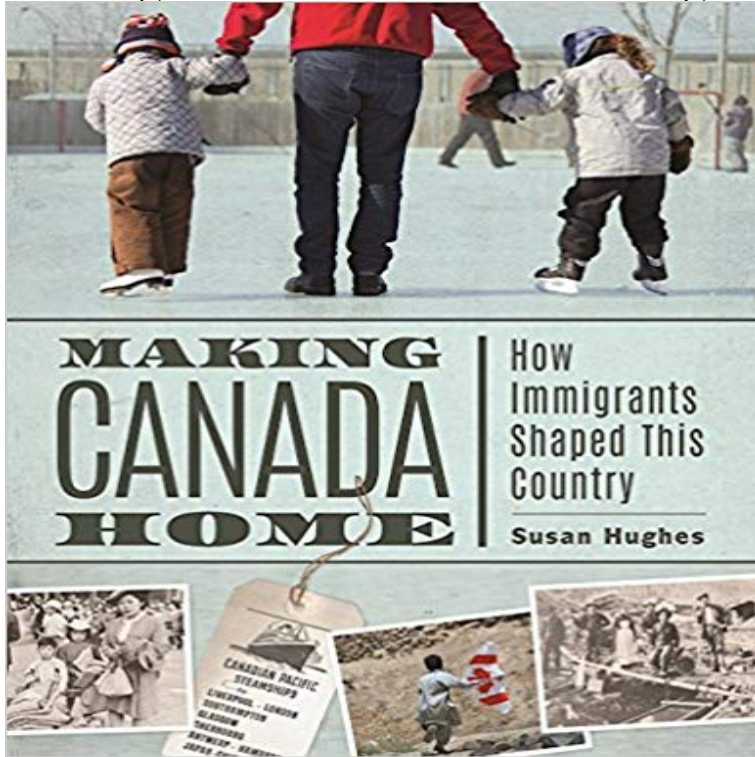


# Making Canada Home: How Immigrants Shaped This Country
