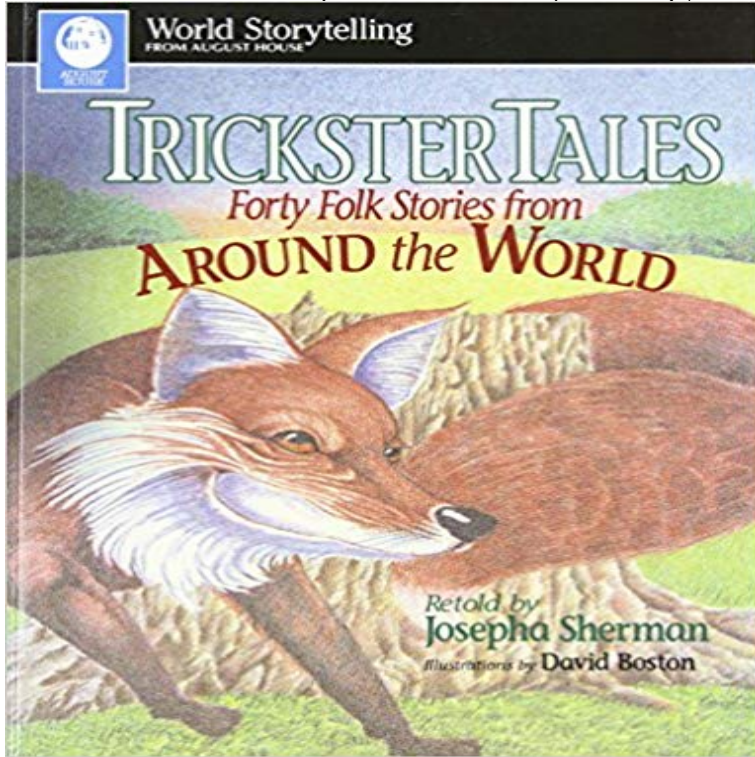


Trickster Tales (World Storytelling from August House)
